**BIKES=EDUCATION=FUTURE! RESULT!** Thanks to an amazing response from the people of **AyIsham** on Bike Race Saturday, **Form 10WH at Cheltenham's All Saints Academy** and several generous individual donors, Support Cambodia were able to provide the young people of **Ta Pung Village** with their 'wheels' in record time. We hope to meet the bikes and their owners in January.



An equally succesful Collection Day at **Morrison's Cromer Store** raised **£262.93** to plant **coconut and dragon fruit trees** on a sustainable farm at Svay Sisophon. This will eventually benefit the whole local community by providing food, cash crop and employment. Thank you, Morrisons, for the invitation.

Still in Sisophon, another very generous private donation has enabled the building of a **Volunteer Office** at the **De Nobili Church Centre** to facilitate the enormous amount of pastoral and social outreach work



that benefits the whole community there.

The final project for 2015 has been the funding of school uniform for 135 children at KCN, Kompong Luong and Chnok Tru on the Tonle Sap Lake. An excellent concert in September, given by piano and flute students of David Shippey and Linda Roy, raised almost half the money needed and a very successful 'Race Night' in November provided the rest. In fact, so successful that there is a surplus! which will be put towards a water project in 2016 - details in the next issue. A terrific effort from everyone. Special

mention for the "Cromer Crowd" for their continuing support for the charity.

**FROM THE TRUSTEES** The Trustees will meet on December 3<sup>rd</sup> and in the meantime wish to say a heartfelt "OKOON CHAREN" to everyone who has helped us make this, our first year as a registered charity, so succesful. We really couldn't have done it without you!

There was great excitement on November 6<sup>th</sup> for the Opening Day of the **Xavier Jesuit School Kindergarten**. For those of us who viewed an empty field just 2 years ago,

**Monsignor Kike Figaredo**, Apostolic Prefect of Battambang Diocese made a short, but action-packed visit to East Anglia in September and was warmly welcomed by communities in **Ipswich**, **Bury St Edmunds**,

Father David Ward's Sponsored Gospel Read at Costessey raised over £500 for projects in St Jospeh's Parish, Ta Hen, Battambang.

Aylsham's **Steve Lock** is making his annual trip to Battambang, spending 4 months distributing rice to rural families and helping out in

'LINKS' is a regular feature, highlighting other places in the UK with links to Cambodia.

Bob Turner, from Blackburn, Lancashire, runs 'Cambodia Craft', the only UK importer of handcrafted Cambodian wooden sculptures. Bob writes here about his work:

"At Cambodia Craft we stock a wonderful range of sculptures and handicrafts from Banteay Prieb. This Jesuit training centre is home for young people disabled by landmines, war, accidents and polio. Here they are educated and learn skills that give them an income and sense of dignity and worth. Each piece is Individually hand carved and bears the name of the artist with a brief story card. They are a treasured ornament or a great educational resource for schools. We fundraise at

craft fairs around UK and pilgrimage events at Walsingham. All proceeds go back to Cambodia to support the artisans and to help towards the Khmer Student Hostel Project. We have links with a number of schools in the north west who help us with fundraising, and have recently introduced the Times Table Challenge which links educational needs across 6000 miles! At the hostel site, preparation ground work began in May and when the land dries we will begin to see the start of the project."

## Lay missionary RODRIGO SANCHEZ writes about his life in Cambodia [edited]

"We live in Pailin, 25 minutes from the Thai border and form a community with the Marist Brothers; Francis [Ghana], Gilbert [Ghana]. Iggie [Korea] and Tim [New Zealand] which means we meet with them to pray, to eat, to organize activities and share what is happening to us.

My wife, Estela, works as a doctor in the morning in 3 different locations. Health services and education are terrible here. Many doctors buy their titles and aim to extort money from the people; they don't really know what to do with the sick. Estela provides medical care, medicines and financial support in cases requiring further studies or interventions. Also we try to do a workshop a month to educate people in health care.



I teach English: to students, young and old, soldiers, police, and teachers. Given the very low quality of education, the challenge is to work a bit for both teachers and students to improve their practice and have more opportunities.

Our son Joshua [5] attends the local kindergarten and plays happily with Cambodian friends. Lucia [11 months] is cared for by a woman named Oum. They love each other so much, I think when it is time to return to Mexico, Lucia will want to stay with her!

On Saturday morning we have community meeting with the Brothers and in the afternoon we hold a moment of prayer and reflection with young and

adult Catholics. On Sunday afternoon there is Mass and then dinner with all the children, youth and adults. Our work is voluntary. We receive no salary but the Marists pay our board and lodging. So, you see, very ordinary."
